Mapping is complete except for some expected last minute changes and course planning is at the review stage. This is a major undertaking with the event featuring the top orienteers from around Australia. We are keen to deliver the event to a high standard. It is some years since WHO took on the challenge of a high calibre event and we have our best team working on it. James McQuillan is the organiser for both events, Robert Bradley is setting the Middle Distance at Wyangala and Steve Dunlop is setting the Long Distance at

Roseberg State Forest. All under the guidance of our Controller/Event Director Rob Vincent from Newcastle. Rob has over the last year updated both maps. The Wyangala map was originally drawn by Gareth Prosser and gifted to WHO. It is a work of art and A3 in size. Graeme Hill transferred the map to OCAD. We are using only a portion of the original map. It was last used in the 1990s so will be fresh for almost all participating on May 18. Roseberg is another large map – in fact three maps that overlap. Part of it was used for the Australian Schools Championships in 2017 and Rob Vincent has updated more of map for use on May 19.

#### 30/31 March 2019

The State League season kicks of at Hill End on the weekend of 30/31 March. Garingal are organising the double event weekend on the map that was created for the 2017 Australian Championships. It is an old mining area with complex gullies and tricky features requiring great concentration. WHO are helping Garingal with some additional helpers on the computer, registration and marshaling. ### **WESTERN SUMMER ORIENTEERING SERIES**

The f rst season of the WSOS has successfully concluded. The aim of the Series was to provide events with a variety of courses for all family members, minimising the use of streets, using a period in the summer season when other events of that nature were not available in the Sydney metropolitan area. The success of the SOS Series during school terms, with similar courses, showed that this approach could f II a gap in the annual schedule for events suitable for families. The numbers of course entries are shown in the following table.

The consistent support for the Series and the clear preference shown for line courses conf rmed that there had been a demand for these kinds of events. It was also seen that there were participants over a wide range of ages from the very young to the old so the courses were catering for everybody. Also, every event had newcomers to the sport competing so the events would have provided opportunities for the ONSW of ce to direct enquirers to suitable local events.

The pattern of the summer calendar 2018/19 was-

- October and November, South Sydney Orienteering Series -December and January, West Sydney Orienteering Series -February, Sydney Sprint Series

This calendar of ered regular access to family suitable events over summer. I believe it is important to keep this pattern of no competition between Series in the metropolitan area. If there are competing events on the same weekend leading to low entry numbers, there would be strong disincentive to club members to put the ef ort into mapping areas and organising events.

The three clubs participating, (WHO, GO and SHOO) I believe, would have been happy with the number of entries this summer. The clubs all produced enjoyable events which supported the aims of the Series.

WHO supplied maps for f ve of the six events and will have suf cient dif erent maps for similar events in summer 2019/20. I propose to coordinate, with support from the clubs, a similar calendar of six events in December and January 2019/20.


