ONSW Meetings and Workshops

Purple Pen Workshop Sat Nov 23 12 noon to 1pm advanced 1pm to 4pm beginners

ONSW will be conducting Purple Pen workshops at KNOX Grammar on Sat Nov 23 right after the SOS event there that morning. The plan is for an advanced forum from 12-1pm where people familiar with PP can swap tips and tricks, then we'll have a beginner workshop from 1-4pm for people who'd like to learn from scratch how to use PP to set courses, and print maps and descriptions.

The PP software is a free download intended for Windows users. There is a Mac conversion but it doesn't always work.

Purple Pen is easy to use, intuitive and does not require any OCAD knowledge - just a pdf of the base map.

Members who wish to attend should bring a laptop. They will be emailed map files prior to save for use in the workshop.

DID YOU KNOW?

No club has won the ONSW club of the year more than WHO. WHO won it in 2018, 2011, 2007, 2000. Garingal and Newcastle have also won it 4 times, Central Coast = 3, Uringa = 2, Wagga = 2, Mountain Devils, Southern Highlands, Northern Tablelands and BushnBeach once each.
